Open Class Livestock Rules

1. All exhibitors must comply with the livestock rules and regulations and open class livestock exhibitor's guide as printed and approved by the Livestock Director of the Kitsap Fair and Stampede Association. Please refer to the Livestock Rules and Regulations at www.kitsapfair.org.
 2. All open class livestock entries must be received by the Kitsap Fair Office on or before August 1st.
 3. All entry fee checks and/or money orders must be made payable to the Kitsap Fair and Stampede or KFSa.
 - a. Please mail to: Kitsap Fair & Stampede, PO Box 2510, Silverdale, WA 98383
 - b. Or drop off at 1300 NW Fairgrounds Rd, Bremerton, WA 98311, Monday through Friday
 4. Entry fees are per class, there are no fees for non-premium or herd type classes.
 5. 4-H and FFA exhibitors must pay open class entry fees when entering open class competitions.
 6. **Entry fees are non-refundable.**
 7. HAUL-IN TIMES: All livestock exhibits will be hauled in Tuesday of Fair Week during the following times only:
 - a. Large Animals: 10 am – 12pm and 1 pm – 9 pm.
 - i. Trailers will be staged inside the Board arena to await the vet.
 - ii. Plan accordingly for wait times.
 - iii. Vet will not be present during designated lunch hour.
 - b. Small Animals: 12 pm – 9 pm
 - i. All animals will be unloaded and checked by vet before being moved into their barns.
 - ii. Please be prepared to wait and have water/cooling devices available for animals.
 - iii. Small animals include dogs, cats, poultry, rabbits, and cavies.
 8. ALL ANIMALS MUST BE VET CHECKED BEFORE ENTERING ANY BARN.
 - a. Decision of entrance into the fair is based solely on the discretion of the fair veterinarian, his/her decision will be FINAL.
 9. Youth age divisions are based on their age on October 1st of the previous year. (i.e. a child's birthdate is 10/2 and they turn 11 they will still be in the 8-10 division)
- Premium Awards:
1. A breed class will only be filled if there are 3 or more exhibits of that breed in that department, otherwise exhibits will be entered in an "other breeds" class.
 2. **Open Youth Showmanship and Market Type will be judged on the Danish system with premium points awarded. Premium points will be as follows:**
 - a. Blue – 40, Red – 30, White – 20
 3. **There will be no cross entry allowed between 4-H, FFA, and Open Market or Showmanship classes.**
 4. **There will be no cross entry allowed between breed type classes and market classes by the same animal.**
 5. **Youth showmanship and market type classes are awarded a**

champion and reserve all around buckle from the Kitsap Fair and Stampede Association.

6. Classes that are outlined in each department as non-Premium will not receive a premium payment for placement in that class.
7. Classes may be divided or combined at the discretion of the superintendent or show chair, to make a more interesting show.

Livestock Skillathon – CLASS 0001

1. A contest designed to test and showcase participants' knowledge and skills in various aspects of livestock management, including breed identification, health care, and production practices.
2. Open to all youth 18 and under.
3. Pre-Registration is required.
4. Teams must be made up of 3 youths within different age groups (i.e. 10, 15, 17-year-old exhibitors).
5. Study guides can be found at www.kitsapfair.org/livestock.
6. Champion, reserve champion, and third place awards will be given to the winning teams.

Livestock Judging – CLASS 0002

1. A class designed to test exhibitors' skill in judging production livestock animals.
2. Pre-registration is required.
3. Awards will be divided into age group lots.
4. Schedule will be announced at fair.

Educational Display - CLASS 0003

1. This is for an additional display contest; awards will be provided.

2. This is a group/team/individual display contest.
3. Each exhibit will be given one 10'x10' horse stall to create an interactive educational display that should be engaging, informative, visually appealing, and effectively convey educational content to the public. This would be very similar to the topics used on an educational poster but on a much larger scale.
4. Every display must be related to agricultural education in some way.
5. Examples are: 4-H club promotion, National FFA leadership and contributions, step inside a cow, how to become a farrier, canning guidelines, etc.
6. All walls inside the stall plus the exterior entrance should be decorated to encourage the public to step inside.
7. A special award will be given to the winning display based on "people's choice" voting during the fair.

Round Robin:

1. Invitation only contest, for youth 18 years old and under.
2. Exhibitors who have received a champion or reserve champion showmanship award are eligible to compete.
3. A Round Robin Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded to each age division.
4. The contest is divided between small animals and large animals.
5. Each contestant will demonstrate their ability to show each animal species in their class (Small or Large Animal).

1. All exhibitors must comply with the Livestock Rules and Regulations and Open Class Livestock Rules as printed and approved by the Livestock Director of the Kitsap Fair and Stampede Association.

6. In group classes of the Cattle Department, all animals kept on the same farm and owned by different members of the same family will be considered as one exhibit and the family unit as one Exhibitor. Exhibitors are not required to be the breeder of animals shown in group classes.
7. It is recommended that cattle have a respiratory complex vaccine at least four weeks prior to fair.
8. All Bulls over one (1) year of age must be shown with a nose lead.
9. All Cattle must be double tied while in stalls.
10. Premier Exhibitor is awarded to top Exhibitor based on total premiums for one breed of cattle shown by Exhibitor.
11. No cross entry is allowed between Open, 4-H, or FFA showmanship and market classes.

Dairy Cattle Department Rules:

1. All exhibitors must comply with the Livestock Rules and Regulations and Open Class Livestock Rules as printed and approved by the Livestock Director of the Kitsap Fair and Stampede Association.
2. Removal of any exhibit prior to dismissal time from display area will be seen as a final act and will result in immediate forfeiture of all premiums, points, and privileges by the Exhibitor. Further, Exhibitor may be suspended from future exhibiting at the Fair.
3. Herdsmanship is required for all exhibitors. Barn duty will be determined by the superintendent and covered in the barn meeting before fair opening. Please review Herdsmanship requirements listed in the Livestock Rules and Regulations.
4. An **entry fee of \$10.00** will be charged for all breed type classes entered in this department.
5. Substitutes may be made if done so prior to 9:00 p.m. on the Tuesday before the Fair. Substitutes must be registered at vet check and approved by the show chair.
6. In group classes of the Cattle Department, all animals kept on the same farm and owned by different members of the same family will be considered as one exhibit and the family unit as one Exhibitor. Exhibitors are not required to be the breeder of animals shown in group classes.
7. It is recommended that cattle have a respiratory complex vaccine at least four weeks prior to fair.
8. All Bulls over one (1) year of age must be shown with a nose lead.
9. All Cattle must be double tied while in stalls.
10. Premier Exhibitor is awarded to top Exhibitor based on total premiums for one breed of cattle shown by Exhibitor.
11. Use of the dairy parlor is by invitation only, please contact the superintendent if you are interested in participating.
12. All cows will be milked in the milking parlor only.
13. Milking times will be scheduled with the barn Superintendent.
14. The milking parlor will be thoroughly cleaned and sanitized after every milking session.
12. Milk will NOT be used for human consumption in any form.
13. No cross entry is allowed between Open, 4-H, or FFA showmanship classes.

Cat Department Rules:

1. All exhibitors must comply with the Livestock Rules and Regulations and Open Class Livestock Rules as printed and approved by the Livestock Director of the Kitsap Fair and Stampede Association.
2. An **entry fee of \$5.00** will be charged for each animal entered in this department.
3. Vet check is mandatory, and proof of current rabies is **REQUIRED**. No animals will be allowed in the barn until after vet check. The vet check card must be displayed on the cat's cage during the fair.
4. It is recommended that cats be dewormed three weeks prior to Fair.
5. A 4 in 1 vaccination, feline leukemia vaccination and flea control are highly recommended.
6. All cats must be clean, healthy, free from parasites and have their claws clipped.
7. Once a cat is sent home for any reason, it stays home for the duration of Fair.
8. Barn will be open at 9:00 AM for cat benching. Make sure you have clean litter, water and food ready during this time.
9. Cats must be ready to go in the barn from 10 AM - 10 PM during the fair. Cats may go home each night; or with the superintendent's approval they may stay in their cage in the cat barn overnight. Peewee and Junior exhibitors may take their cats home at 6 PM with the Superintendents' permission.
10. A 44" x 22" x 22" benching cage will be provided for each cat. Exhibitors must provide their own litter tray, food and water dishes.
11. Water dishes must be at least half-full with clean water at all times.
12. Food is required to be in the dish at all times unless the cat is on a special diet. If the cat is on a special diet, a sign on the cage is required.
13. Litter trays must be clean at all times. Exhibitors will be contacted to clean if necessary.
14. The floor, back, top and sides of the benching cage must be covered. A privacy screen must be located in front of the litter box.
15. Cage doors **MUST** be secured with 4 carabiner clips. **NO LOCKS**.
16. In-theme cage decorations are highly encouraged. The superintendent will reach out to you providing the barn decoration theme after registration. Decorations are allowed on top of the benching cage, but must not exceed two feet above the cage. Materials used inside the cage ***must*** be cat safe.
17. The exhibitor must confine their cats to the exhibit area, show ring and designated grooming area. The exhibitor must handle their own cats. This includes bringing the cat up for competition. If the exhibitor is not there to put their cat up for type judging, the cat will not be judged.
18. Only the exhibitor will do the grooming, preparation and exhibiting of their cat. All grooming to be done in designated grooming areas only.
19. Exhibitors may show more than one cat in type class if space allows. Both cats may stay in the same cage if they are accustomed to each other.
20. No tranquilizers or stimulants will be allowed unless approved by a vet, with written notice to the Superintendent.
21. Equipment must include an approved cat harness on the cat at all times and have leather or nylon approved leash attached whenever the cat is out of its cage. Exhibitors must provide their own grooming tools.
22. All exhibitors are required to do Herdsmanship.
23. Cat age classes are as follows: Kitten 4 - 8 months old; Adult 8 months - 10 years; Senior 10+ years
24. No pregnant or nursing cats may be entered.
25. Cats may be released on Sunday at 6 pm but are not allowed to leave the barn until all equipment, decorations, cages, and personal belongings are cleaned up, as determined by the Superintendent.
26. No cross entry is allowed between Open, 4-H, or FFA showmanship or type class.

Dog Department Rules:

1. All exhibitors must comply with the livestock rules and regulations and open class livestock rules as printed and approved by the Livestock Director of the Kitsap Fair and Stampede Association.
2. Herdsmanship is required for all exhibitors. Barn duty will be determined by the superintendent and covered in the barn meeting before fair opening. Please review Herdsmanship requirements listed in the Livestock Rules and Regulations.
3. An **entry fee of \$5.00** will be charged per class.
4. Removal of any dog prior to dismissal time from the display area will be seen as a final act and will result in immediate forfeiture of all premiums, points, and privileges by the Exhibitor. Unless approved by the Open Class Dog Superintendent and Livestock Director for extenuating circumstances only. Contact the Barn Superintendent with any health concerns immediately.
5. Class substitutes may be made if done prior to 9 a.m. on the Monday of fair week. Superintendent must approve substitutes.
6. Dogs younger than 6 months are not allowed.
7. Exhibitors must present a certified rabies form from your veterinarian or a written statement from your veterinarian on the clinic's letterhead as proof of current rabies vaccination. Vaccine must be administered at least 21 days prior to the start of Fair.
8. It is recommended that all dogs are administered the Bordetella vaccination within 14 days of exhibit.
9. All dogs are subject to Vet check by a fair approved veterinarian. Only dogs that appear healthy and free of external parasites will be allowed to enter. It is recommended that all dogs be tested and treated for internal parasites, 30 days or less, prior to Fair.
10. It is also recommended that flea prevention be administered to your dog prior to the Fair.
11. Vet check is Tuesday of fair week from 12 pm to 8 pm, next to the rabbit barn.
12. Bitches in season will not be allowed.
13. Any dog that shows signs of aggression will be asked to leave the fairgrounds at the discretion of the Barn Superintendent and Livestock Director.
14. Peewee showing will be held on Saturday of the fair. This will include Showmanship, Obedience and *Rally (*if time allows). All Peewee's will participate in the Beginner Novice Obedience.
15. All youth exhibitors are the responsibility of their parent/guardian.
16. For exhibitors younger than 8, the dog must be double leashed with a parent while coming and leaving the fair and while taking the dog out unless in the ring.
17. Dogs and exhibitors are to be checked into the barn by 8:30 a.m. Wednesday-Sunday of the Fair.
18. There will be a mandatory Dog Barn meeting at 9 a.m.
19. Exhibitors must take their dog(s) out of their cages to exercise every 2 hours and record it.
20. Only the exhibitor is allowed to take the dog out of the cage.
21. Dogs must wear a flat buckle collar while in their cage without tags.
22. Dogs should have access to water while in their cage. Water bowls/buckets must be attached to the side of the cage. No feeding of dogs while in their cage or in the Dog Barn, this includes food, treats, or chews.
23. Dogs may have toys in cages except toys with squeakers.
24. No dogs shall be left in the barn overnight.
25. Youth 10 years old and under may leave with their dog at 6pm each night of the fair.
26. All other exhibitors and their dogs are required to be in the barn until 10 pm every night of the fair except Sunday.
27. Dogs are released on Sunday at 6 pm but are not allowed to leave barn until all equipment, decorations, cages, and personal belongings are cleaned up, as determined by the Superintendent.
28. No cross entry is allowed between Open, 4-H, or FFA showmanship.

2. Removal of any exhibit prior to dismissal time from display area will be seen as a final act and will result in immediate forfeiture of all premiums, points, and privileges by the Exhibitor. Further, exhibitor may be suspended from future exhibiting at the Fair.
3. Herdsmanship is required for all exhibitors. Barn duty will be determined by the superintendent and covered in the barn meeting before fair opening. Please review Herdsmanship requirements listed in the Livestock Rules and Regulations.
4. An **entry fee of \$6.00** will be charged for each breed type class entered in this department.
5. **All sheep must have scrapie tags or premise ID to comply with National Scrapie Eradication Program and WAC 16-89-022.**
6. Age will be determined by teeth and registration papers (registration papers must be present at time of entry). Lambs shown by breeder do not need papers.
7. Registered animals will be shown in breed lots, all unregistered will be shown in "other breed" lot.
8. Exhibitors may enter up to two (2) animals in any one lot.
9. All sheep entered in flock, get or pair lots must also be entered in an individual lot. Get pairs and young flock must be owned by the exhibitor. Registration papers must be recorded in the name of the exhibitor and be presented on the entry day.
10. Where there is no competition, the judge, in his/her opinion, may award 2nd premium in place of 1st.
11. Any class with only one exhibitor will automatically go into "other breed" group.
12. No cross entry is allowed between Open, 4-H, or FFA showmanship and market classes.
13. Lads and Ladies Lead Rules:
 - a. The purpose of this activity is to promote the sheep industry by presenting an attractively modeled wool garment (at least 70%) with a well-groomed sheep in a manner to give spectators the opportunity to see wool in both its beautiful forms, on the hoof, and in the completed garment (not a costume).
 - b. Lads and Ladies Lead is a combined Open Class, 4-H and FFA event.
 - c. Entry forms will be available on the information board next to Sheep Office in the Sheep barn and must be returned by 4:00 p.m. on event day.
 - d. Sheep must be conditioned, fitted, and trained to show on a halter.
 - e. The sheep must have been shown in their appropriate class in the Open Sheep Show, 4-H Show, or FFA Show and may be shown only once in the Lads and Ladies Lead Class. Only the participant will handle the sheep (Exception: Minimum assistance may be provided for participants age 6 and under).
 - f. Entries shall include a description of the garment to be worn, the background of the contestant, and the breed of sheep. This description will be read aloud as written while the contestant and his/her animal promenade the ring.
 - g. Entrants will be judged on the garment and its appearance, the appearance of the sheep, and the coordination in handling between the two. Remember, you are promoting wool and the sheep industry to the public.
 - h. A name sign may be attached to the exhibit, no larger than 12 x 18 inches.
 - i. People's Choice award will be voted on during the event.
 - j. The Superintendent reserves the right to disqualify any entry deemed inappropriate for a family fair.

Wool Department Rules:

1. All exhibitors must comply with the livestock guidelines and open class livestock rules as printed and approved by the Livestock Director of the Kitsap Fair and Stampede Association.
2. Removal of any exhibit prior to dismissal time from display area will be seen as a final act and will result in immediate forfeiture of all premiums, points, and privileges by the Exhibitor. Further, Exhibitor may be suspended from future exhibiting at the Fair.
3. An **entry fee of \$3.00** will be charged for each Fleece entered in this department.
4. Fleece must be from animal owned by consignor.
5. All entries must be from the current year or fall of the previous year's clip and represent not more than 12 months growth. Lamb fleeces must be noted on the entry form. (Lamb is seven months or less).
6. Limit of two entries per lot per class.
7. Fleeces should be tied with paper twine or not tied, as desired. Place in a large, clear unmarked plastic bag for transporting.
8. Commercial classes will be judged according to commercial value/yield in the commercial market. White crossbred fleeces may be entered in the commercial classes only and are not eligible for breed type.
9. Breed classes will be judged according to their respective breed standards. Where there is only one exhibitor, the fleece(s) will be entered in Lot 14 or 15 as appropriate. If there is more than one exhibitor for a breed not listed, a Lot will be created.
10. Natural colored fleeces will be entered according to grade. If entered incorrectly, the Superintendent will have the authority to place it in the correct class. All natural-colored entries will be judged as hand spinning fleeces.
11. Where there is no competition, or where there are fewer entries in a class than number of premiums offered, the judge may, at his/her discretion, award premium or premiums of such grade as the exhibit deserves. The decision of the judge will be final.
12. Entries must be in place, in the sheep barn, between the hours of 1:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. on Tuesday, the day before Fair. Entries will be released at 6:00 p.m. Sunday, or the same time that sheep are released.

2. Removal of any exhibit prior to dismissal time from display area will be seen as a final act and will result in immediate forfeiture of all premiums, points, and privileges by the Exhibitor. Further, Exhibitor may be suspended from future exhibiting at the Fair.
3. Herdsmanship is required for all exhibitors. Barn duty will be determined by the superintendent and covered in the barn meeting before fair opening. Please review Herdsmanship requirements listed in the Livestock Rules and Regulations.
4. An **entry fee of \$6.00** will be charged for each breed type class entered in this department.
5. No feed pans will be left in stalls except when pigs are eating. Exceptions to this will be at the Superintendent or Veterinarians discretion.
6. No veterinarian will be called for by anyone other than the owner, Superintendent, or Livestock management.
7. Stalls will be cleaned each morning before 9:00 a.m. NO EXCEPTIONS.
8. No pens will be top dressed at any time during the Fair. Pens will be cleaned daily.
9. Exhibitors will not remove swine from stalls without permission of Superintendent & supervision of an adult, if necessary.
10. It is recommended that swine be vaccinated at least four weeks prior to Fair.
11. All Swine must be treated for LICE within 48 hours prior to Fair Vet Check.
12. No boars over 6 months of age allowed.
13. No cross entry is allowed between Open, 4-H, or FFA showmanship and market classes.
