To promote Washington agriculture, economic growth, and ecology, we will showcase FFA student efforts and leadership through the Kitsap Fair & Stampede. We will provide a positive experience for the FFA members and the public.

#### AIMS AND PURPOSES OF THE WASHINGTON STATE FFA:

It is the goal of the Washington State FFA to produce a setting for Agriculture Education students to feature and display, for the public, agriculture projects developed through the Supervised Agricultural experience Program and FFA. The objectives of the Washington State FFA Exhibition are:

- 1. To promote and develop leadership skills for the leaders of the 21st century.
- 2. To feature and display agriculture products from our programs including livestock, mechanics, plants, natural resources, and related educational materials.
- 3. To help in the training of youth through educational contests, displays and demonstrations.
- 4. To promote the agriculture industry and rural living and their interaction with the urban community.
- 5. To promote wholesome, worthwhile educational and entertainment activities for the interest of all people.
- 6. To institute and carry out both short and long range planning.
- 7. To present, for public viewing, a well balanced and wide variety of exhibits and displays.
- 8. To feature the rich agricultural heritage and diversity of our state.
- 9. To conform with rules and regulations as set forth in the Washington State Department of Agriculture Fairs Laws.

#### **GOALS OF THE WASHINGTON STATE FFA:**

- 1. Improvement of Herdsmanship and exhibits to reflect the high quality of the FFA.
- 2. Promote the FFA exhibition through public relations, newspaper articles, radio, television & the speaker's bureau.
- 3. Strive for excellence in exhibits and demonstrations.
- 4. Preserve the positive image of the FFA and its programs through a superior exhibition.
- 5. Promote science and technology in agriculture.
- 6. Increase the level of sponsorship for awards.
- 7. Increase participation in the FFA.

#### **RULES OF CONDUCT:**

- 1. FFA members must follow and are under the rules of the Local school district, and during the Kitsap County Fair must follow special rules pertaining to the Fair.
- 2. FFA members must follow the FFA Code of Ethics as spelled out in the official FFA manual.
- 3. Students are prohibited from sleeping and/or lounging in or about stall areas.
- 4. Swearing, cursing, cussing and other use of "strong language" by a student is prohibited.
- 5. Smoking while wearing a FFA jacket is prohibited.
- 6. Disciplinary Action: Students out of compliance with the rules of the Fair will be first dealt with by the advisor. If this action does not remedy the situation, then the responsible supervisory person shall deal with the issue. Any difficulty beyond this point shall be dealt with by a state staff person.

#### FFA EXHIBITION RULES & REGULATIONS

#### LIVESTOCK DIVISION:

- 1. All Open Class Livestock rules apply as applicable.
- 2. Exhibitors are Limited to two entries per Lot.
- 3. Entries are open to purebred and high grade stock fitted by Washington FFA members and must be part of the students or chapters S.A.E. project. All entries are to be approved by the Local agriculture instructor. Exhibits will be accepted only from active chapters of FFA. Animals should be trained, clipped and in show condition before coming to the Fair.
- 4. Entries are due July 15<sup>th</sup> and must be submitted online at <a href="http://kitsap.fairentry.com">http://kitsap.fairentry.com</a>
- 5. All FFA entries must be properly marked and be projects or activities of bona fide FFA members.
- 6. The Kitsap Fair reserves the right to withhold premium payments from any exhibitor holding outstanding bills incurred during the fair, from any exhibitor conducting himself/herself in a manner unbecoming to the FFA.
- 7. All FFA members, as defined in the National constitution, and students regularly enrolled in Agriculture Education, shall be eligible to show animals in division. A student may show until November 30<sup>th</sup> following the fourth National FFA Convention after graduation from high school.
- 8. Animals acquired less than two months before the show are not eligible. Sheep

- purchased at an approved Junior Show/Sale can be shown at the FFA Exhibition. Exhibitor must show his/her own animal except when he/she has more than one animal in a class.
- 9. Exhibitors of leased animals must provide a dated copy of the lease agreement with entry materials and/or at the request of the Superintendent or Fair Manager.
- 10. The FFA Exhibition will follow the guidelines of the Memorandum of Agreement between the Washington State FFA and the Washington State 4-H as to the showing of animals in both 4-H and FFA.
- 11. FFA Superintendent Duties:
- a. Be present and receive entries during the entire published haul-in time.
- Be present when exhibits are judged.
   Assist the judge by organizing show area, presenting ribbons and recording judge's placing.
- c. Be present when exhibits are released.
- d. Check appearance of exhibits whenever possible. Show management will write a request to school administrators for services of FFA Superintendents, when requested.
- e. The Superintendent's main responsibility is to work with the students on Herdsmanship, making sure that all chapters are keeping their areas in Blue Ribbon condition.
- f. Superintendents will judge
  Herdsmanship in their own and other

- areas as directed by the Herdsmanship Superintendent.
- 12. Judging and awards will be on the Danish System. Cash awards will be made on the point system. The judge has the right to disqualify any animal for a reason. Animals not properly fitted and trained for showing will be rejected.
- 13. Stall cards will be furnished during vet check.
- 14. There will be no horns on dairy animals unless allowed by breed standards. All horned animals must have horn protectors.
- 15. If a student is asked to use his/her animal in the judging contest he/she must comply.
- Chapters are responsible for bringing their own brooms, pitch forks and shovels.
- 17. Chapters must provide a divider between tack area and animals. Hay

- and straw must not be stacked up as a divider.
- 18. All judge's decisions are final. Protests must be made in writing accompanied by a fee of \$10.00 and filed with the Manager within 24 hours after the cause of the protest. The fee will be forfeited.
- 19. Fitting of animals must be done by the FFA member only, with minimal assistance from another FFA member or FFA Advisor. Any other person fitting animals will be grounds for disqualification of exhibitor.
- 20. Exhibitors showing in Breed type and or Auction classes must also enter in Showmanship Class.
- 21. All exhibits must have a stall decoration/display and educational poster in the designated space.
- 22. All exhibits are entered at the sole risk of the exhibitor.

#### **SPECIAL CONTESTS:**

#### Poster – CLASS FFA 01

- 1. A Poster is like a billboard, with very few words and a strong visual message. It is strongly recommended that a poster has no more than 25 words.
- 2. The lettering should be in clear, dark print of at least one inch in height.
- 3. Posters must be easily read from 10 feet. If the exhibit is unreadable from 5 feet, the item will be disqualified.
- 4. Must illustrate one main idea.
- 5. Must contain accurate information. Inaccurate information may lead to disqualification.
- 6. Posters or graphs must be entered on poster board only. Poster or graph must be 22" x 28" in size.
- 7. Any material that is not poster board will not be accepted. Entry will be disqualified if incorrect material is used.
- 8. Any previously entered OR judged educational display(s) MAY NOT be re-entered.
- No Educational Display(s) will be accepted if paint/ink/glue is still wet or if they include liquids, there may be no adhesives of any kind left exposed that may stick to another display.
- 10. Dimensional attachments must be securely attached and may not stick out over ¼ inch. Loss of one ribbon placing for items sticking out over ¼ inch.
- 11. Any misspelling or grammatical error may drop the Educational Display one ribbon placing when judged.
- 12. NO COPYRIGHTED ILLUSTRATIONS, CARTOONS OR PRODUCT LABELS OF ANY KIND MAY BE USED IN EDUCATIONAL DISPLAYS. NO EXCEPTIONS. Any Educational Displays that include any of the above will be disqualified.
- 13. Poster should be "consumer oriented". The message should be something that a consumer (in this case, the average fairgoer) would be interested in knowing and/or learning.

#### Story Boards - CLASS FFA 02

- 1. A Story Board is four to eight visual images (not including photographs) that tell a story.
- 2. Story Boards will be entered on 32 x 36 Poster Boards of any color.
- 3. There is no "readable form" requirement; however, lettering should be large enough that story board can be easily read.

#### Photo Essays - CLASS FFA 03

- 1. A Photo Essay is eight to twelve photographs that tell a story.
- 2. Photo Essays will be entered on 32 x 36 Tri-Panel Display Boards of any color. Any other size will be disqualified.
- 3. There is no "readable form" requirement; however, lettering should be large enough that it can be easily read.

#### Round Robin:

- 1. Invitation only contest, for FFA Exhibitors.
- 2. Exhibitors who have received a champion or reserve champion award are eligible to compete.
- 3. A Round Robin Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded to each age division.
- 4. The contest is divided between small animals and large animals.
- 5. Each contestant will demonstrate their ability to show each animal species in their class (Small or Large Animal).

#### Other Displays:

- Other Educational and agriculture related displays are encouraged.
- All need to be approved by the livestock director or still life coordinator prior to August 1<sup>st</sup>.
- See open class exhibitor's guides for possible classes to enter. Premiums may be awarded if judges are present and entry deadlines are met.
- Approval will be based on space availability.
- At the discretion of the 4-H coordinator/superintendent FFA exhibitors may present a Public Presentation in the President's Hall during allotted hours. Premium points may be awarded.



## Department: FFA Beef

#### **Beef Department Rules:**

- 1. All exhibitors must comply with the Livestock Rules and Regulations and Open Class Livestock Rules as printed and approved by the Livestock Director of the Kitsap Fair and Stampede Association.
- 2. Removal of any exhibit prior to dismissal time from display area will be seen as a final act and will result in immediate forfeiture of all premiums, points, and privileges by the Exhibitor. Further, Exhibitor may be suspended from future exhibiting at the Fair.
- 3. Herdsmanship is required for all exhibitors. Barn duty will be determined by the superintendent and covered in the barn meeting before fair opening. Please review Herdsmanship requirements listed in the Livestock Rules and Regulations.
- 4. Exhibitors are to wear hard leather shoes or leather boots, slacks or jeans and a shirt with sleeves in the show arena.
- 5. Exhibitors showing beef animals in conformation/type classes must also enter the Showmanship Contest.
- 6. Grooming, handling, exercising of project animals and Herdsmanship must be performed only by FFA exhibitor.
- 7. In cases when the exhibitor is physically incapable, only another FFA member may provide minimal assistance as needed.

- 8. While on Herdsmanship or working with the animals, exhibitors are to wear leather boots or muck boots only.
- 9. All participants will fit their animal entirely themselves.
- 10. It is recommended that cattle have a respiratory complex vaccine at least four weeks prior to fair.
- 11. All bulls over one (1) year of age must be shown with a nose lead.
- 12. All cattle must be double tied while in stalls.
- 13. No cross entry is allowed between Open, 4-H, or FFA showmanship and market classes.

# Department: FFA Dairy

#### **Dairy Cattle Department Rules:**

- All exhibitors must comply with the Livestock Rules and Regulations and Open Class Livestock Rules as printed and approved by the Livestock Director of the Kitsap Fair and Stampede Association.
- 2. Removal of any exhibit prior to dismissal time from display area will be seen as a final act and will result in immediate forfeiture of all premiums, points, and privileges by the Exhibitor. Further, Exhibitor may be suspended from future exhibiting at the Fair.
- 3. Herdsmanship is required for all exhibitors. Barn duty will be determined by the superintendent and covered in the barn meeting before fair opening. Please review Herdsmanship requirements listed in the Livestock Rules and Regulations.
- 4. It is recommended that cattle have a respiratory complex vaccine at least four weeks prior to fair.
- 5. All Bulls over one (1) year of age must be shown with a nose lead.
- 6. All Cattle must be double tied while in stalls.
- 7. Use of the dairy parlor is by invitation only, please contact the barn superintendent if you are interested in participating.
- 8. All cows will be milked in the milking parlor only.
- 9. Milking times will be scheduled with the barn Superintendent.

- 10. The milking parlor will be thoroughly cleaned and sanitized after every milking session.
- 11. Milk will NOT be used for human consumption in any form.
- 12. No cross entry is allowed between Open, 4-H, or FFA showmanship classes.

## Department: FFA Goat

#### **Goat Department Rules:**

- All exhibitors must comply with the Livestock Rules and Regulations and Open Class Livestock Rules as printed and approved by the Livestock Director of the Kitsap Fair and Stampede Association.
- 2. Removal of any exhibit prior to dismissal time from display area will be seen as a final act and will result in immediate forfeiture of all premiums, points, and privileges by the Exhibitor. Further, Exhibitor may be suspended from future exhibiting at the Fair.
- 3. Herdsmanship is required for all exhibitors. Barn duty will be determined by the superintendent and covered in the barn meeting before fair opening. Please review Herdsmanship requirements listed in the Livestock Rules and Regulations.
- 4. All goats must have scrapie tags or premise ID, ID will be requested at the time of entry.
- 5. There will be a pre-show milk-out after 6:00 p.m.
- 6. No horned animals except meat goats and horns must be capped. Exhibitors must have the superintendent's approval.
- 7. Tack or milking areas will be provided only if space allows. Exhibitors may need to share these spaces.

- 8. Pack goats will cover a multi-level obstacle course.
- 9. Cart goats will be expected to compete in harness.
- 10. No bucks are allowed.
- 11. Exhibitors in Utility Goat should wear hiking clothes and shoes. Exhibitors' clothing should be suitable for the weather conditions on the show day.
- 12. Pack Goats must have 10 miles accumulated and be documented.
- 13. Harness Goats must have 10 hours accumulated and be documented.
- 14. Pygora goats will be shown in Showmanship and separate type class with Pygmies.
- 15. Fleece goats will be shown with Sheep.
- 16. Every exhibitor is responsible for providing educational material for the general public.
- 17. Any harsh handling will not be tolerated and will be grounds for dismissal at the discretion of the Superintendent and Livestock Director.
- 18. No cross entry is allowed between Open, 4-H, or FFA showmanship and market classes.

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## Department: FFA Horse

#### **Horse Department Rules:**

- All exhibitors must comply with the livestock rules and regulations and open class livestock rules as printed and approved by the Livestock Director of the Kitsap Fair and Stampede Association.
- Removal of any exhibit prior to dismissal time from display area will be seen as a final act and will result in immediate forfeiture of all premiums, points, and privileges by the Exhibitor. Further, Exhibitor may be suspended from future exhibiting at the Fair.
- Herdsmanship is required for all exhibitors. Barn duty
  will be determined by the superintendent and covered
  in the barn meeting before fair opening. Please review
  Herdsmanship requirements listed in the Livestock
  Rules and Regulations.
- 4. Horses entered in walk/trot must only be entered in walk/trot for the entirety of the show.
- Any horse that is unmanageable or creates a disturbance will be asked to leave the grounds, at the discretion of the Horse superintendent and Livestock Director.
- 6. All horses must fit in the stalls provided. No stall modifications are allowed.
- 7. All exhibitors must wear approved safety helmets.
- All exhibitors must wear closed toe shoes and appropriate clothing while handling or tending to horses, including exhibiting, cleaning, washing, watering, feeding, herdsmanship, etc.
- 9. All exhibitors must be aware of the public and request they maintain a safe distance from all animals when outside of their stall/cage. If necessary, barriers can be put in place, please request this with the Superintendent and Livestock Management.
- All Exhibitors must attend a mandatory barn meeting on Tuesday of fair week (location and time will be provided at vet check).
- 11. Only animals stalled in the horse barns may be shown.

- 12. Stalls must be cleaned and checked by the Superintendent prior to leaving after 6pm Sunday.
- 13. All exhibits must have an educational poster on their stall and stall decorations.
- 14. Classes may be changed with approval from the Show Chair.
- 15. It is required that all exhibitors enter Showmanship, Trail or Riding Pattern, English/Western Class, and a minimum of two equitation or games classes (or a combination of the two). Additional classes may be entered.
- 16. Premium points will be given on the following Classes. Showmanship, Trail or Riding Pattern (English/Western) Class, and your highest 2 Classes from performance and games. Costume & Gymkhana are not premium Classes.
- 17. Advanced riders wishing to ride Bareback Novice or Bareback Novice W/J or W/T will be allowed. Games riders will be allowed to participate in novice riding classes. These are the ONLY cross entries allowed.
- 18. No cross entry is allowed between Open, 4-H, or FFA showmanship classes.
- EQUINE FACILITY RULES: See Equine Barn manager for copy of rules. These will also be posted on the entry booth at the lower horse arena, as well as provided to all leaders.
- 20. CHAMPIONSHIP RULES: If large Classes are to be divided and all high blues are returned to a championship Class, the grand and reserve champion will be picked on the merit of this Class only. No additional points or credit will be added for grand or reserve. If no championship Class is required, the grand and reserve championship will come from the two highest blues in each Class at the discretion of the judge.

- GENERAL RULES FOR SHOWMANSHIP, EQUITATION, JUMPING & TRAIL OR RIDING PATTERN (ENGLISH/WESTERN):
- General Rules come from the 4-H Horse Contest Guide PNW574
- b. Grooming of the project animal and herdsmanship at the fair must only be performed by the exhibitor. Parental supervision is encouraged. However, in the event of an emergency which is endangering an exhibitor or someone from the public's safety, adult help is acceptable.
- 22. TRAINING CLASS (EQUITATION) ENGLISH OR WESTERN:
- Equine must never have been shown in any event in a bridle with a bit other than a ring snaffle, d-ring or a bosal.
- b. Equine are to be shown at a walk, trot/jog and/or canter/lope both ways of the arena without undue restraint and may be required to canter/lope a figure eight, stop, turn and back in a straight line with extremely light rein. Results shown by performance of the equine are not to be considered more important than method used in obtaining them.
- c. Good hands are paramount. Two hands must be used with a snaffle or bosal. When split reins are used with the snaffle, they must be crossed between your hands so both hands are holding the reins. Closed reins are allowed with a bosal.
- d. Bosals must be rawhide braided, leather braided or rope. Absolutely no iron will be permitted under the jaws regardless of how padded or taped.
- e. Personal Attire: may be either English or Western but must meet specifications under attire in appropriate equitation section.
- f. Tack: A standard stock seat saddle for Western and proper English types for hunt or saddle seat. Saddle seat CANNOT show in a full bridle in this Class; must be snaffle only. Running martingales are permitted in training only.
- 23. CART EQUITATION CLASS: To be shown in a suitable two-wheel cart at a walk, trot and road gait (extreme speed to be penalized) both ways of the ring. To stand quietly and back readily. Contestants to be judged on light hands with reins, posture and cleanliness of animal

- and driver to count. The ability to control the animal and perform gaits when asked will be paramount. General ring showmanship shall also be judged.
- 24. EQUINE GROOM SQUAD CONTEST:
- a. Open to teams of 3 FFA equine project members.
- b. Team members may be from different clubs and do not have to be exhibiting an equine at the fair.
- Groom squad competition will be in accordance with 4-H State Fair guidelines.
- d. Each team will furnish their own grooming equipment and supplies.
- 25. TRAIL HORSE IN HAND: Open to all equine that has never been shown in any event under saddle.
- 26. Exhibitors receiving Champion or Reserve Champion in Showmanship are invited to go on to Round Robin to compete for overall showman.

#### **Llama Department Rules:**

- 1. All exhibitors must comply with the Livestock Rules and Regulations and Open Class Livestock Rules as printed and approved by the Livestock Director of the Kitsap Fair and Stampede Association.
- 2. Removal of any exhibit prior to dismissal time from display area will be seen as a final act and will result in immediate forfeiture of all premiums, points, and privileges by the Exhibitor. Further, Exhibitor may be suspended from future exhibiting at the Fair.
- 3. Herdsmanship is required for all exhibitors. Barn duty will be determined by the superintendent and covered in the barn meeting before fair opening. Please review Herdsmanship requirements listed in the Livestock Rules and Regulations.
- 4. No llamas will be washed at the Fair.
- 5. Any Ilama unmanageable by exhibiting member will be sent home.
- 6. Any llama showing extreme signs of stress will be sent home.
- 7. No tranquilizers will be allowed.
- 8. An exercise area will be assigned for llamas. Llamas will not be allowed in other areas of the Fairgrounds without special permission from the 4-H Llama Superintendent.
- 9. Llamas owned by members must be attended by their owner every day of the Fair.
- 10. Only approved llama gear and equipment is to be used at the Fair on the llamas. If there are any questions concerning the issue, the 4-H Llama Superintendent will determine if the equipment is safe and appropriate.

- 11. Due to safety concerns, only intact male llamas over 6 months and under 24 months of age, female llamas over 6 months, and gelded males may be shown. Intact males will not share stalls. Geldings will have first priority over the intact males if there are not enough stalls available.
- 12. Llamas need to be vaccinated yearly and checked for lice. You are to give your 4-H leader a certificate showing that your llamas have had their health check-up.
- 13. No cross entry is allowed between Open, 4-H, or FFA showmanship classes.

- All exhibitors must comply with the livestock rules and regulations and open class livestock rules as printed and approved by the Livestock Director of the Kitsap Fair and Stampede Association.
- 2. Herdsmanship is required for all exhibitors. Barn duty will be determined by the superintendent and covered in the barn meeting before fair opening. Please review Herdsmanship requirements listed in the Livestock Rules and Regulations.
- 3. Entries will be accepted based on first come, first served.
- Breed and Variety shall be listed in the description. Review the American Poultry Association (APA) standard for breeds and variety descriptions.
- 5. All birds must be checked in, vet checked and caged by 9:00 pm Tuesday prior to Fair.
- 6. All birds are required to have leg bands for identification, must be noted on entry form.
- 7. See General Health Requirements in Livestock Rules.
- a. Birds that are not in good condition or have obvious parasites will be turned away.
- b. Birds must be washed and clean, eyes must be bright, and bird must be alert.
- Body condition must be adequate, no missing/pecked or clipped feathers will be allowed.
- d. No birds younger than 4 months of age will be allowed unless entered in the Kitsap County Junior Livestock Auction (KCJLA), see the auction rules for specific requirements and species allowed.

- 8. Provide your name and contact number to the Superintendent in case of emergency.
- 9. All exhibitors will be required to provide their own feed and maintain their own feed in the provided coop cups.
- 10. Prior to 9:00 am each day exhibitors will be responsible for feeding and watering their birds, cleaning their own cages and walkways in front of their cages.
- 11. Exhibitors shall not remove any exhibit prior to dismissal time on the last day of Fair without prior approval from the Livestock Director and Poultry Superintendent.
- 12. Upon dismissal, exhibits shall be removed from cages, placed in transport carriers in the Poultry Barn courtyard, and Exhibitor is responsible for cleaning their cages and pens, no exceptions.
- 13. Failure to complete Herdsmanship will result in immediate forfeiture of all premiums, points and future privileges of the exhibitor may be suspended.
- 14. Judging will take place when the Poultry Judge arrives, and birds will be judged based on the American Poultry Association (APA) standard of perfection.
- a. Decisions of the Judge(s) are final and not open for debate.
- Distribution of ribbons are at the discretion of the judge(s) and are based on the quality of the exhibits.
- 15. No cross entry is allowed between Open, 4-H, or FFA showmanship and market classes.

## Department: FFA Rabbit

#### **Rabbit Department Rules:**

- All exhibitors must comply with the livestock rules and regulations and open class livestock rules as printed and approved by the Livestock Director of the Kitsap Fair and Stampede Association.
- Herdsmanship is required for all exhibitors. Barn duty will be determined by the superintendent and covered in the barn meeting before fair opening. Please review Herdsmanship requirements listed in the Livestock Rules and Regulations.
- 3. Open to FFA Rabbit project members enrolled in GBIA only.
- Each Rabbit exhibitor may enter a maximum of five rabbits but may be limited to fewer because of cage availability. Can be any combination of purebred, pet quality, crossbred and altered rabbits.
- 5. Rabbit exhibits shall be at least 90 days of age by Wednesday, the first day of Fair, and have been in the exhibitor's possession by May 1st (Possession meaning taking care of). For meat class rabbits, the exhibitor must have owned the doe (dam) by May 1. See Class Information for age / weight restrictions.
- 6. To exhibit at Fair, all Rabbit project members are required to:
  - Enter Educational Display in Rabbit lot, unless enrolled in both Rabbit & Cavy projects, then either Rabbit or Cavy lot
  - b. Attend two work parties during the year, completing a minimum of 2 hrs per work party.
- 7. All Rabbit Exhibitors are required to feed their animal(s) and clean the cage(s) daily prior to 9:00 a m
- All Rabbit Exhibitors are required to bring their rabbit(s) to the type table or, if unable, the exhibitors shall make other arrangements for their rabbit(s) to be brought to the type table.
- All Rabbit Exhibitors are required to enter Showmanship with their own rabbit entered in Type.
- 10. All Rabbit exhibitors are required to clean in and under their rabbit cages and help with the barn clean

- up chores before their rabbit(s) will be released at end of Fair.
- 11. Determination of show lot will be as follows: Commercial or heavy breeds having a 9 lbs. minimum, senior ideal weight.
  - a. Senior 8 months of age or older
  - b. Intermediate 6 to 8 months of age
  - c. Junior Under 6 months of age
  - d. Fancy or small breeds less than 9 pounds, senior ideal weight
  - e. Senior 6 months of age or older
  - f. Junior Under 6 months of age
- 12. Refer to weight standard for each breed in the most current ARBA "Standard of Perfection". A scale will be used at time of judging and over or under weight calls for disqualification. Champion and Reserve Champion Ribbons may be awarded for Best of Breed and Best Opposite Sex for each breed exhibited as determined by the Judge. No Additional Premium points are awarded. Champion Ribbon awards may be given for Overall Best in Fur, Overall Best in Wool & Best in Show. Reserve Champion Ribbon awards may be given for first Runner Up in Show, provided quality of animals merit the awards.
- 13. All entry information shall be checked and verified by the exhibitor on the check-in day. Any change in information needs to be made by the exhibitor on the exhibitor check-in sheet and given to the superintendent. Any changes made need to be reported to the 4-H Coordinator before the opening of the fair. After the start of the fair, all information will be deemed correct and disqualifications may occur if discrepancies are found, unless it was a clerical error.

- exhibitor. Registration papers must be recorded in the name of the exhibitor and be presented on the entry day.
- 9. Where there is no competition, the judge, in his/her opinion, may award 2nd premium in place of 1st.
- 10. Any class with only one exhibitor will automatically go into "other breed" group.

## Department: FFA Wool

#### **Wool Department Rules:**

- All exhibitors must comply with the livestock guidelines and open class livestock rules as printed and approved by the Livestock Director of the Kitsap Fair and Stampede Association.
- 2. Removal of any exhibit prior to dismissal time from display area will be seen as a final act and will result in immediate forfeiture of all premiums, points, and privileges by the Exhibitor. Further, Exhibitor may be suspended from future exhibiting at the Fair.
- 3. Fleece must be from animal owned by consignor.
- 4. All entries must be from the current year or fall of the previous year's clip and represent not more than 12 months growth. Lamb fleeces must be noted on the entry form. (Lamb is seven months or less).
- 5. Limit of two entries per lot per class.
- 6. Fleeces should be tied with paper twine or not tied, as desired. Place in a large, clear unmarked plastic bag for transporting.
- 7. Commercial classes will be judged according to commercial value/yield in the commercial market. White crossbred fleeces may be entered in the commercial classes only and are not eligible for breed type.
- 8. Breed classes will be judged according to their respective breed standards. Where there is only one exhibitor, the fleece(s) will be entered in Lot 14 or 15 as appropriate. If

- there is more than one exhibitor for a breed not listed, a Lot will be created.
- Natural colored fleeces will be entered according to grade. If entered incorrectly, the Superintendent will have the authority to place it in the correct class. All naturalcolored entries will be judged as hand spinning fleeces.
- 10. Where there is no competition, or where there are fewer entries in a class than number of premiums offered, the judge may, at his/her discretion, award premium or premiums of such grade as the exhibit deserves. The decision of the judge will be final.
- 11. Entries must be in place, in the sheep barn, between the hours of 1:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. on Tuesday, the day before Fair. Entries will be released at 6:00 p.m. Sunday, or the same time that sheep are released.

- 9. It is recommended that swine be vaccinated at least four weeks prior to Fair.
- 10. All Swine must be treated for LICE within 48 hours prior to Fair Vet Check.
- 11. No boars over 6 months of age allowed.
- 12. No cross entry is allowed between Open, 4-H, or FFA showmanship and market classes.
